**T**HE World Summit on “Peace, Security and Human Development” will be convened on August 9-13, 2014 in Seoul, Korea. The World Summit is organized and sponsored by the Universal Peace Federation (UPF), an NGO in Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations. A highly selective group of delegates from around the world will be in attendance, including current and former heads of state and government, women leaders, and parliamentarians.

There is a growing awareness among people throughout the world of the urgent need for innovative vision and bold leadership if we are to resolve the critical issues of our time. With this in mind, the World Summit will bring together world leaders whose individual and collective experience, wisdom and insight are needed if we are to build a world of peace and prosperity for all the world’s peoples.

High-level sessions will address topics such as:

- Peace, Security and Human Development: The Asia Pacific
- Peace, Security and Human Development: Africa
- Peace, Security and Human Development: The Middle East
- Peace, Security and Human Development: The Americas
- Peace, Security and Human Development: Europe and Eurasia
- The Global Economy and Sustainable Development: Challenges and Opportunities

In addition to the high-level sessions of the World Summit, delegates will be offered a wider range of opportunities to meet with high-level officials representing the government, academia, the private sector and the media.





## Root Causes of Conflict

Today the world faces many conflicts: political, religious, economic and cultural. Too many families struggle with divorce, abandonment, abuse, poverty and neglect. As individuals, we recognize a fundamental weakness, preferring what is easy and convenient rather than what is right and just. What is the root of all these conflicts?

## Conflict Prevention

Geopolitics, natural resources, environmental change, the global arms trade, and other factors have fueled and prolonged conflict as well as mutual mistrust and antipathy. Such prolonged conflict poses a fundamental challenge to world stability: how can such conflicts be transformed by longer-term peacebuilding efforts?

## Peacebuilding

Assessments of conflicts and social ills from spiritual or religious perspectives have not been included in the UN's studies. UPF proposes to combine statesmanship and good governance with the wisdom of the world's faith traditions and principles of spiritual practice.

While welcome winds of democracy have been blowing across the globe, freedom should be accompanied by transparency and protective security.


## Regional Security







# Global Highway for Peace

## The “Korean–Japan Tunnel” project



FOR decades, there have been discussions about developing a global highway network to promote trade and interaction. Speaking at an International Conference on the Unity of the Sciences in Seoul, Korea, in 1981, Rev. Sun Myung Moon introduced a vision for a global highway system including a tunnel between Japan and Korea. “Of course this is a lofty dream,” he said; “but every great undertaking begins as a dream.”



Symposia have been dedicated to the theme, and the proposal has drawn support from political leaders, philanthropists and engineers. Exploratory excavations have been conducted.

Such a bold transportation investment would facilitate trade between Japan, Korea and China, promoting mutual development and prosperity.




# Bering Strait Crossing



**I**N 2005 Rev. Moon proposed a bridge or tunnel connecting Russia and the US across the Bering Strait. He described it as a historical necessity, given the long history during which the geographical separation between Russia and the US had served as an obstacle to trade and cooperation between East and West.

Roads and highways facilitate connections between nations. The tunnel connecting the United Kingdom and France marked a new relationship between the two nations that had waged war on each other for hundreds of years.

The idea of a Bering Strait crossing has captured the imagination of engineers despite the challenges of working in extreme conditions on land and sea. Environmental issues and the interests of indigenous communities are additional concerns. The research, planning and implementing of such a project would stimulate the exchange of people and ideas, which can lead to peace and development as the transportation network becomes a reality.


